

『Physical Therapy Korea』 Contribution Rules

1. This journal publishes original articles, case reports, review articles and other invited papers selected by the Physical Therapy Korea review committee, with the publishing decision coming from the editorial committee.
2. The corresponding author should be a member of the Physical Therapy Korea before submission (the membership fee 30,000 Won, the annual fee 50,000 Won). Other authors should be a member if a manuscript is approved for publication, or can be published after revision. In the case of students, authors are qualified to be a member by paying the membership fee, annual fee (the membership fee 10,000 Won, the annual fee 30,000 Won).
3. Manuscripts should be submitted to the online submission system (<http://submission.ptkorea.org>).
4. The author must write a "Cover Letter", write a "Copyright Transfer Form" and compile an "Author's Check List" when submitting the manuscript.
5. Submitted manuscripts must not be published in other journals and they may not publish their article in another journal without permission.
6. Submitted manuscripts must take into consideration sex/gender differences and not be gender-specific. Additionally, manuscripts must describe the sex/gender of the subjects and the reasons for reporting any gender-specific data. Authors should consider that their research ought to contribute to future studies, knowledge creation, and be useful for those of diverse groups (especially in terms of sex/gender). It is also recommended that authors provide gender-specific data, when appropriate, in describing scientific validity or specifically state they are studying gender-specific or rare diseases.
7. Submitted manuscripts must:
 - (1) be written in HWP (2010 or above)
 - (2) mark English in parenthesis with small letters, but capitalize the first letter when it is a proper noun
 - (3) have Arabian letters written in the text, and must use the metric system of weights and measures
 - (4) have the author's family name after their first name for the English abstract
 - (5) have pictures clear enough to be recognized even if printed in black and white
 - (6) have a title and details in the captions of graphs, tables, and figures, and these must be written in English for both Korean and English journals
 - (7) attach an English abstract to both Korean and foreign language manuscripts
 - (8) have English abstracts under 300 letters
8. The reference in the text should have the author and the year in parenthesis, without superscript. Use a semicolon (;) to list two or more sources and order author in ABC (alphabetical) order.
 - (1) When using an author as a subject:
 - If there is only one author: e.g.) Lee(2005)은, Andrew (2012) is ...
 - If there are two authors: e.g.) Choi와 Kim(1992)은, Song and Jones (2009) are ...
 - If there are three or more authors: e.g.) Yoon 등(2004)은, Teyhen et al (2011) were ...
 - (2) When citation comes after the sentence: ... was mentioned. (Jun, 2011; Kim and Baek, 2003; Whittaker et al, 2007).
9. The reference must be cited if it is quoted in the text.
10. The reference must be written in English.
 - (1) If the reference is a journal: cite all the names if there are three authors or less; if there are four or more, write the names of the first three authors and use "et al." Example:

Park KN, Cynn HS, Kwon OY, et al. Effects of the abdominal drawing-in maneuver on muscle activity, pelvic motions, and knee flexion during active prone knee flexion in patients with lumbar extension rotation syndrome. Arch Phys Med Rehabil. 2011;92(9):1477-1483. <http://doi.org/10.1016/j.apmr.2011.03.020>

(* Attach subtitle-with a colon (:), and enter the Digital Object Identifier (DOI) after the page number in URL format.)
 - (2) If the reference is a book:

Kisner C, Colby LA. Therapeutic Exercise: Foundations and techniques. 5th ed. Philadelphia, PA, F.A. Davis Co., 2007:63-65. (* In the case of a book, capitalize first letter of each word in the title. Connect the subtitle of the book with a colon(:) and capitalize only the first letter. Use a comma after the publishing company and its location.)
 - (3) If the reference is a chapter of a book:

Szklut SE, Breath DM. Learning disabilities. In: Umphred DA ed. Neurological Rehabilitation. 4th ed. St Louis, Mosby, 2001. (* List the cited chapter of the book first and then enter the editor and the title of the book after "In:". Mark as "ed." if there is only one editor after "In:" and "eds." if there are two or more editors.)
 - (4) If the reference is a thesis:

Lee WH. Effect of rotational load on the thickness and activity of abdominal muscles during shoulder horizontal abduction in lying on the foam roller in subjects with and without low back pain. Seoul, Yonsei University, Doctoral Dissertation. 2012. (* The thesis for master's degree should be expressed as "Master Thesis" and that for doctor's degree should be expressed as "Doctoral Dissertation".)
 - (5) Korean literature is cited using the same format.
 - (6) Foreign journals should use the Index Medicus abbreviation notations, but if there is no abbreviation noted in the Index Medicus, write the name written in the journal.
11. The editor might make some revisions that does not go far off the original text or postpone the publication, if the wording and system of the submitted manuscript does not meet the contribution rules.
12. Members or nonmembers who want to subscribe to a journal without paying the annual fee must sign up and pay for a subscription separate from the annual fee.
